School of Computer Sciences: The management and monitoring of classes of each year M.Sc admission is entrusted with a Faculty Advisor. It is the faculty advisor who prepares the semester exams schedule, seminar schedule and monitor the students and teachers in implementing the same on time. He/She is the main and intimate mentor/counsellor to the students of his/her batch. All grievances of the students will be first addressed by him. The IQAC coordinator of the School is in charge of keep tracking of all internal quality assurance activities of the School. It is he/she who collects all data and the proofs from the stakeholders and arranges them in chronological manner. It is he who gives awareness to the other related people on the activities of IQAC. 7.3 – Institutional Distinctiveness

7.3.1 – Provide the details of the performance of the institution in one area distinctive to its vision, priority and thrust in not more than 500 words

Mahatma Gandhi University envisions to excel in the field of higher education and cater to the scholastic and developmental needs of the individual, through continuous creation of critical knowledge base for the society's sustained and inclusive growth. Since the University is a public funded system, the issues of the stakeholders are of prime concern. COVID-19 is a serious threat to humanity, the University has extended all of its sophisticated analytical laboratory facilities to fight against COVID-19. The IUCBRSSH of University has approved as a COVID 19 testing centre by the Govt. of Kerala and ICMR/DHR in March 2020 since the institute was already equipped with all the facilities including high end equipment required for the RT-PCR testing. COVID19 patient samples testing started from 29 March 2020 and several samples have been tested during the assessment period. However, as on Aug 31, 2021 more than 3,00,000 samples have been tested (from 27 March 2020) and results were disseminated within 24 hours of receipt of samples in the centre. The Laboratory works in 3 shifts 24 x 7 in support of Govt. of Kerala to break the chain of COVID-19. Among the State universities in Kerala, IUCBRSSH under Mahatma Gandhi University is the only ICMR and Govt of Kerala approved COVID19 testing centre. University has given utmost priority to fight against COVID -19 not only by providing laboratory facilities but with manufacturing and supply of hand sanitizers, awareness creation (online media) etc. Experienced researchers were engaged in the COVID -19 test (PCR Facility) at Government Medical College, Kottayam. Additionally University has given required relaxation for its students for paying various fees, examination schedule and pattern, online examination and viva voce, extension of research period, examination centre allotted for students in their home district (examinations were conducted in Lakshadweep also) etc. All these activities are being monitored precisely in an academic point of view for the creation of new knowledge for the sustained growth and well being of the society.
